

City of Bolivar
Called Council Meeting
June 28, 2021
6:00 p.m.

The Bolivar City Council met in called session, Monday, June 28, 2021, at the Bolivar Municipal Building with the following attendance:

Mayor McTizic welcomed everyone then called the meeting to order and asked Councilman Crawford to open the meeting with prayer, followed with the Pledge of Allegiance. The Mayor also announced the city offices will be closed Monday July 5th in observance of Independence Day.

The purpose of the Special Called session was as follows:

A. 2nd Reading – Public Hearing on Ordinance 21-001, An Ordinance to Amend the Budget Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2020-21

At this time Mayor McTizic asked for a motion to adjourn from Executive Session to Public Hearing. Councilman McKinnie made a motion, seconded by Councilman Spinks to adjourn to go to Public Hearing. All voted "Aye." There being no public questions nor comments, Councilman McKinnie moved, seconded by Councilman Crawford to reconvene to Executive Session. All voted "Aye." Mayor McTizic asked if there were any questions concerning Ordinance 21-001. There being no questions, Councilman Rhea made a motion, seconded by Councilman Lowe to approve Ordinance 21-001 on 2nd Reading. All voted "Aye."

B. 2nd Reading – Public Hearing on Ordinance 21-002, An Ordinance to the City of Bolivar, TN Adopting the Annual Budget and Tax Rate for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2021, ending June 30, 2022

At this time Mayor McTizic asked for a motion to adjourn from Executive Session to Public Hearing. Councilman McKinnie made a motion, seconded by Councilman Spinks to adjourn to go to Public Hearing. All voted "Aye." There being no public questions nor comments, Councilman McKinnie moved, seconded by Councilman Woods to reconvene

to Executive Session. All voted "Aye." Mayor McTizic asked if there were any questions concerning Ordinance 21-002. There being no questions, Councilman Spinks made a motion, seconded by Councilman McKinnie to approve Ordinance 21-002, adopting the annual budget and tax rate for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, on 2nd Reading. All voted "Aye."

C. Proposal for Garbage Truck Buy Back

Mayor McTizic introduced Mr. David Schweitzer with Rivercity Hydraulics and turned the meeting over to him. Mr. Schweitzer explained the buyback program and the possible buy back of the garbage truck bought from Rivercity in 2019. He told the Council Rivercity Hydraulics was offering \$185,000 to buy back the garbage truck and in return the city will buy a newer version of the same truck. Being a part of the buyback program will let the City of Bolivar receive a newer truck model every two years and also keeps the truck's parts under warranty for these two years. After discussion, Councilman Rhea made a motion, seconded by Councilman Lowe to approve Rivercity Hydraulics buying back of the city's garbage truck bought in 2019 and accepting \$185,000 for it. All voted "Aye".

D. Consideration and Possible Approval of Purdue Pharam Bankruptcy Reorganization Plan

Attorney Steve Maroney updated the Council on the filing of the claim against the Purdue Bankruptcy case. Mr. Maroney said at this time he does not know how much the city will get from this lawsuit. The nationwide distribution for the case is estimated at \$5 billion and approximately \$130 million will go to Tennessee. He also stated it is not determined how the money will be allocated throughout Tennessee. The deadline to vote to approve this reorganization is July 14, 2021 and it was asked that all submissions be made by July 9, 2021. Mr. Maroney asked that the council to vote and approve this reorganization and that he would handle all paperwork once the Mayor has signed off on it. After a short discussion, Councilman Rhea made a motion, seconded by Councilman McKinnie to accept the reorganization plan of Purdue Pharam and to have Attorney Steve Maroney file the paperwork on behalf of the City of Bolivar. All voted "Aye".

There being no further business, Councilman McKinnie made a motion, seconded by Councilman Spinks to adjourn the meeting. All voted "Aye."
